








The Model





Key points about the Model

- The local hospital is in the centre
- The hospital is involved in the marketing,
 selection and mentoring of students &
 employment of graduates
- They have an opportunity to groom their future employees
- Students are linked to the hospital through annual holiday work, leading to a healthy community, accountability between the students & hospital staff



Support UYDF provides

- Comprehensive financial support
 - tuition, accommodation, books, food, minor
 equipment

Academic & Social Mentoring Support

- -students meet monthly with a mentor
- -includes students doing holiday work &
 attending the Student Lifeskills Imbizo where
 "soft skills" and relevant issues facing youth
 are workshopped



Mentoring Support at University

- Academic and Social mentoring support is provided to all students to assist them to overcome their challenges & succeed
- Have a network of mentors, who assist students to identify their challenges & develop a plan of action
- Mentors hold students account able to implement their plan & obtain the assistance they need
- Holiday work forms part of the mentoring support



Impact

• High levels of **graduate compliance**

- New healthcare services have been added to rural hospitals (psychology; optometry; speech therapy; laboratory)
- Increased number of health care profession als who understand the language and culture of patients

Graduates serve as role models to the youth



The UYDF has shown:

1. Rural youth are able to succeed at university, *if provided the necessary support.*

93% pass rate over the last 4 years

2. That graduates will return and work at a rural hospital if required to.
Majority working at rural hospitals – only 7% have gone into the private sector
Of the 70 whose contracts are complete, 63% are still working at rural hospitals



Scaling for greater impact

- HRH Strategy 2012/13 2016/7
 Strategic Objective 8 refers to HR strategies
 to increase numbers of HW's in rural,
 underserved areas
- Specific mention is made of:
 - Targeted admission of rural students
 - Continuous professional development of HW's in rural areas
 - Rural-bonded scholarship schemes



UYDF can assist in achieving these objectives

- Targeted admission of rural students provide mentoring support to these students to ensure they have the best opportunity to succeed
- Rural-bonded scholarship schemes use the UYDF Model, which has resulted in high levels of student success and graduate compliance
- We provide continuous professional develop ment opportunities for rural HW's as a retention strategy



Barriers to greater impact

The UYDF Model could **potentially be used to significantly increase university success** of rural & Quintile 1 & 2 health science students & **increase compliance of graduates** bound by work-back obligations.

HOWEVER, funding an **increasing number of students** each year is a limiting factor to UYDF scaling its work for greater impact.



Overcoming the Barrier

- The Public Health Enhancement Fund (PHEF) contributes to increasing the number of rural origin medical students
- The National Student Financial Aid
 Scheme (NSFAS) & the National Skills
 Fund (NSF) are also potential sources
 of funds to achieve the HRH objectives



Conclusion

The UYDF has the capacity, knowledge and experience to significantly increase its impact on the HRH for rural and underserved areas should funding be made available
